








We do this by setting the standards official statistics must meet in the <u>Code of Practice for Statistics</u>. We ensure that producers of official statistics uphold these standards by conducting assessments against the Code. Those which meet the standards are given National Statistics status, indicating that they meet the highest standards of trustworthiness, quality and value. We also report publicly on system-wide issues and on the way that statistics are being used, celebrating when the standards are upheld and challenging publicly when they are not.

Our vision is simple. Statistics should serve the public good.

Statistics should be produced in a trustworthy way, be of high quality, and provide value by answering people's questions: providing accountability, helping people make choices and informing policy.

Our <u>5-year plan</u> sets out our vision and priorities for 2020-2025 and how we will contribute to fostering the Authority's ambitions for the statistics system. Safe outputs: screened and approved outputs that are non-disclosive.





Data-governance law—the legal regime that regulates how data about people is collected, processed, and used—is the subject of lively theorizing and several proposed legislative reforms. Different theories advance different legal interests in information. Some seek to reassert individual control for data subjects over the terms of their datafication, while others aim to maximize data-subject financial gain. But these proposals share a common conceptual flaw. Put simply, they miss the point of data production in a digital economy: to put people into population-based relations with one another. This relational aspect of data production drives much of the social value and harm of data collection and use in a digital economy.

This Feature advances a theoretical account of data as social relations, constituted by both legal and technical systems. It shows how data relations result in supra-







Code of Practice

Code of Practice for Statistics

The Code of Practice for Statistics sets the standards that producers of official statistics should commit to. The Code benefits all of us, as users and citizens. Compliance with the Code gives you confidence that published government statistics have public **value**, are high **quality**, and are produced by people and organisations that are **trustworthy**.

On 5 May 2022, the Office for Statistics Regulation revised the Code of Practice for Statistics, to reflect two changes to release practices, T3.1 and T3.6 in principle T3: Orderly release. These changes follow a consultation on proposals to enable some greater flexibility on the timing of the release of official statistics, while the standard release time remains as 9.30am


